<u>Tips for Creating a Day of Service from Allen High School:</u>

- TIMING: Get started early! Allow yourself and your team a few months to prepare and promote the event
- SCHEDULING: Take advantage of a half day or a day with an already modified class schedule to reduce the number of hours students are away from class
- INVOLVEMENT: Involve other clubs at your school to help with planning and organizing day of activities
- STUDENT LEADERSHIP: Empower students by giving them leadership roles in organizing the event and promoting the event amongst other students
- NONPROFIT INVOLVEMENT: Connect with the community to provide activities for students that benefit local nonprofits
- LOCAL BUSINESSES: Involve local businesses to donate products or funds to support projects and activities
- <u>DIVERSE ACTIVITIES:</u> Provide a large number of projects so students have diverse service opportunities. For example, Allen HS provided 9 different projects on their day of service.
- SUPPORTING TECHNOLOGY: Empower students with technology like x2VOL an easy way to sign up for activities, record service hours, and write reflections for deep personal growth.
